Bonaire pool/clubhouse usage: Bonaire has offered usage of their pool and clubhouse to residents for a fee:

- For the pool: \$260.00 for the first year and \$130 every year thereafter to renew. The fobs are included in the price. Only 2 fobs allowed, if they are lost or need a 3rd one, they are \$25.00 each.
- To use the clubhouse: price is \$400.00 with a \$400.00 deposit to be returned when and if the clubhouse is cleaned and no damages have been made, in which case the deposit may not be returned.



Safety Corner

Mixing Common Cleaners

All cleaners consist of chemicals and some combinations can be extremely hazardous to your health. No matter the cleaning task, certain cleaners should never be mixed with each other:

1. BLEACH + VINEGAR = CHLORINE GAS

The chlorine in bleach reacts with the acetic acid in vinegar. At higher levels of exposure, it can lead to chest pains, swelling, and blistering of the throat, lungs, eyes, and skin.

2. BLEACH + AMMONIA = CHLORAMINE VAPORS

Chloramine gas causes many of the same respiratory problems and blistering described above. In at least one instance, it's led to severe lung injury.

3. BLEACH + RUBBING ALCOHOL = CHLOROFORM

Bleach contains sodium hypochlorite. Rubbing alcohol — known as surgical spirits in the UK — contains ethanol or isopropyl alcohol. Chloroform can be absorbed through the skin as well as inhaled and can damage the nervous system, eyes, lungs, skin, liver, kidneys, and other organs.

4. HYDROGEN PEROXIDE + VINEGAR = PERACETIC ACID

This combination creates peracetic acid, a highly corrosive liquid. Peracetic acid is readily absorbed through the skin and is a very toxic compound that can burn the mucous membranes of the mouth, throat, and esophagus.

5. DRAIN CLEANER + DRAIN CLEANER = EXPLOSION

Different drain cleaners rely on different chemicals to power through grime and clogs. Some are acidic, while some are alkaline (basic). When one doesn't work, you might be tempted to try a different product to get the drain flowing freely again. **Don't!**

The first drain cleaner is still in your pipes, and still active, so adding a second one can cause a chemical reaction that sends corrosive ingredients spraying all over you and your home. If the first drain cleaner doesn't work, call a professional.



Q&A from the Neighborhood

Q: How to use the Remind App?

A: Go to your mobile "AppStore or PlayStore", search for the Remind App icon, and install, then open the App to find and select "White Oak Springs" as your school. There is a lot of "Basics" Ready for Use articles at https://help.remind.com



Q: When are the HOA meetings? What do you talk about?

A: Quarterly meeting dates and locations are listed on the left side of Page 1(this makes it easy to retain the first page of this newsletter and hang somewhere as a reminder). These meetings are very important for our community. It's a forum to ask questions and have a say in what is being done in the neighborhood. For example, your HOA board is currently working on the landscaping at the front entrance, more changes coming to the playground, repairs to common area and projects with Precinct #3 Commissioners office. Anyone can attend these meetings, but the meeting will be adjourned when completed, and re-open for an executive meeting on sensitive homeowner finances or concerns.

Q: Can we reserve the playground for kids parties and how much would it cost? A: Yes, the HOA Board will accept a donation to reserve the playground for a kids party. The donations collected will be used to sponsor Easter Egg hunts or other future events.

- Anyone reserving the playground is expecting to clean-up after the party, including replacing the receptacle trash bag with an empty one, removing their trash bag. Any damages caused by the party attendees would be the responsibility of the person reserving the playground.
- Note: Any area outside of the playground fence is not White Oak Springs property and permission must be obtained to use this area from the MUD board.
