Vandalism, November 21, 2021:

Reported by our neighbors on Sunday, Nov 21, 2021, our front marquee was vandalized and our two spotlights were completed torn out of the electrical receptacles and taken. Our power to both the front marquee and the flag pole was completely out.

The HOA has hired an electrician to come out and check out the status of the front power and to CAP/Secure the front marquee spotlights at this time.

As an HOA Community, when our subdivision is damaged or vandalized, all of us as homeowners pay for the repairs. Our insurance deductible is higher than the repairs themselves, so there is no benefit to opening a new claim for this, as it may cause our premiums to increase. The HOA Board will report this to the non-emergency Sheriff's number so that there is a police report on record of the vandalism/theft (713-221-6000, option #6). If anyone has any information on this vandalism/theft or any questions regarding this, please email the HOA Board at WOSHOABoard@gmail.com and we will response within 48 hours.

Construction at the end of White Oak Falls Ct update:

The new fence was provided by Adkisson Development to replace the wire fence that was initially put up. Special thank you to board member Erika Pena-Valdez for working with the business on this.

Protected Yield study: The board requested a study of the intersection of White Oak Springs and Huffmeister by the Harris county engineering department. No crashes were reported at this intersection for the last 5 years and no observed vehicular turning conflicts or delays were seen so there will not be a protected yield light put in at this time.





There is however a left turn yield sign on both sides. Please be very cautious when leaving our neighborhood whether you are going straight or making turns. The best assumption is to assume the law will not be followed and be prepared to wait for those who decide to disregard the yield. And as always watch for pedestrians crossing. Stay safe out there!



Playground update



Winter is coming! Don't forget to prepare.

We are all super busy during the holidays and in Houston, the holidays rarely mean snow. But we all need to try and make time to prepare our homes for cold weather. Especially after experiencing the freeze in February, now would be a great time to reflect on that and be prepared for this year.

- 1. Inspect your home's heating and air conditioning system: Regularly servicing your furnace helps you catch problems before expensive breakdowns, prolong the furnace's life, and keep it running more efficiently.
- 2. Flush & insulate your hot water heater: These should be flushed twice a year and preferably before winter begins.
- 3. Check the seal on exterior wood: Scrape away the bad paint and old caulk, apply new caulk and a fresh coat of paint
- 4. Do a quick energy audit and check for air leaks: Hold a candle in front of possible drafts. If the flame wavers, you have an air leak.
- 5. Insulate hot water pipes: Insulate the hot water pipes in your attic or garage by snapping foam sleeves on them.
- 6. Make sure your safety detectors are working: Test all of your smoke detectors to make sure they are working and that they have good batteries. If your home does not have carbon monoxide detectors, consider getting some.
- 7. Clean your chimney: Get your fireplace cleaned and inspected before you start building those cozy fires. A chimney sweep company will make sure the fireplace is safe to use, and it can also identify maintenance problems. (Little side note here, I had my own fireplace inspected last fall and there was a crack up the back that I couldn't see myself. This was fixed but could have started a fire when I used it during the snowstorm)
- 8. Clean out your gutters: If channels are blocked and the weather gets freezing, water will turn into ice and add weight to the gutters, which could cause them to tear away from the house.
- 9. Prepare your outdoor pipes: Make sure your sprinkler system is properly shut down for the season. Cover any outside water pipes with foam sleeves and outside water spigots with covers. If you can't find covers, wrap them in dishtowels and string (Another side note, I learned this last year when I missed the rush to buy covers and they were all gone).
- 10. Clear dead trees and branches: If there are branches up against your house, it's a good idea to trim them away before winter, so you don't have ice-coated branches against your or your neighbors siding or windows.

In case of a power outage:

Consider investing an alternate heat source as a backup before an outage occurs: There are some very good propane type heaters on the market that are specifically made to use indoors. It's very important to make sure they are made for indoor use to reduce carbon monoxide poisoning.

Purchase a small tent or tarps: Keeping a small area warmer is easier than a big room. A tent can be set up in the living room and in case of a power outage, everyone can pile into the tent and keep warm. Tarps can also be hung in larger rooms and over windows to reduce the size and keep cool air out.
