# Prevent Day & Night






When outdoors, prevent mosquito bites by using an EPA-registered insect repellent that contains one of the following: DEET, picaridin, IR3535, oil of Iemon eucalyptus/ PMD, or 2-undecanone. Follow product instructions.




Once a week, empty, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots, or trash containers. Check inside and outside your home.



When weather permits, wear long sleeves, long pants, and socks. For infants, place mosquito netting over infant carriers, cribs, and strollers.



Don't feed the storm drain. Sweep lawn clippings, leaves and tree limbs from sidewalks and driveways.



Install or repair screens on windows and doors to keep mosquitoes outside. Use your air conditioning, if possible.



Household pets can be exposed to West Nile virus (WNV). Contact your veterinarian for more information.











### How Harris County residents can prepare for hurricane season

Harris County has seen seven major floods since 2015, and the 2020 hurricane season was the most active on record, according to Jeff Lindner, a meteorologist with the Harris County Flood Control District.

Hurricane season runs from June 1-Nov. 30, and Lindner shared the following tips for preparedness at the April 20 Cy-Fair Houston Chamber of Commerce meeting.

**Buy flood insurance.** Because flooding is not covered by homeowner's or renter's insurance, Lindner said flood insurance is crucial. Policies typically go into effect 30 days after purchase.

"There really is no flood season here. We can flood any time," he said.

While only 25% of county residents have flood insurance, Lindner said the average flood insurance payout after Hurricane Harvey was \$120,000 compared to \$5,000-\$8,000 those who did not have flood insurance received in assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

Compile a disaster supply kit. A comprehensive disaster supply kit should include: seven to ten days of food, water, first aid supplies, cash, tools, medication, flashlights with extra batteries, a battery powered radio, pet food and supplies, sanitation items. Important family documents, photos, documents and comfort items.

**Make a plan.** Households should have a plan in place covering communication, special needs considerations, knowing how to shut off utilities and deciding when to evacuate and when to shelter in place. "Everybody talks about the decision to evacuate, but sometimes the decision not to evacuate is just as important as the decision to pull that trigger," Lindner said.

**Stay informed.** Lindner recommends following official sources such as <a href="www.harriscountyfws.org">www.harriscountyfws.org</a>, which reports the latest local rainfall levels. ### Back to School in 2021:

## Cy-Fair ISD no longer planning to offer virtual school in 2021-22

Less than a month after district officials first publicly announced plans to launch Cy-Fair ISD Virtual School in 2021-22, Leslie Francis, assistant superintendent for communication and community relations, confirmed the district is "no longer exploring this option" in a June 7 email.

The Texas Legislature, whose regular session ended May 31, did not pass legislation that would have funded online learning offered through public school districts.

When Chief Academic Officer Linda Macias presented the proposed plan for a virtual school at the May 10 board meeting, she was clear that the tuition-free, full-time, standalone school was dependent on state lawmakers approving full funding of such programs.

According to the proposal, the program would have catered to students in grades 4-12 living within CFISD's boundaries and would have offered the district's core curriculum and limited opportunities for electives, dual-credit, Advanced Placement and career and technical education pathways.

The 2021-22 school year is slated to start Aug. 23, and the district expects an enrollment of about 116,100 students.

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
